Mandatory Personal Anthology: Requirements

Two full length novels or plays (or one of each) from the approved list (found at <http://mseffie.com/AP/APtitles.html>). It should be something that you have not studied in school or read before. Include three key passages (one from the beginning, the middle, and the end of each novel). **Annotate each key passage.**

Three short stories from the approved list that you have not studied in school or read before. Include one key passage from each. Annotate each key passage.

Six annotated poems from each of the following time periods:

Sixteenth and Seventeenth Century

Eighteenth Century

Nineteenth Century

Seven published poems from the Twentieth Century to present day

Your anthology will include a total of thirty works of literature. **Anything less will not be accepted.**

The introduction must be four to five pages typed, double spaced, a font of 12, with a one inch margin. If you choose to handwrite it the introduction must be seven to ten pages. The introduction must be included. *The introduction should explain why you chose each of the works of literature, how they relate to you, how they relate to the world, how it changed/affected you or a combination of any of the above.* You should include quotes from the various texts to support your statements. **THIS SHOULD NOT BE A PLOT SUMMARY OF EACH TEXT!!!**
